- Abusive Head Trauma is the main cause of inflicted injury in babies resulting in death or serious impairment for the rest of the babies life. HSCB received a presentation on an innovative campaign aimed at reducing these cases. The campaign includes education and masterclasses, leaflets, a short film and licences for an app called DadPad for two years. HSCB agreed the funding for this campaign and a working group will be established to progress this work.
- Following the new approach to the S11 Keeping Children Safe audit , two review days took place in June where the 4LSCBs heard from 14 agencies. Feedback from partners was positive with learning opportunities identified across the wider partnership.
- The joint protocol between Hampshire Safeguarding Children Board (HSCB), Hampshire Safeguarding Adult Board (HSAB) and the Health and Wellbeing Board (HWB) was agreed by HSCB .
- HSCB received a presentation on the Partners in Practice, Children’s Social Care Transformation taking place between now and Autumn 2018. The aim of the programme is;
 - * A family service – a system focussing on improving outcomes for the child in the context of their family
 - * A social work led, integrated multi-disciplinary service, from the front door through to specialist services.
 - * Social workers are supported to deliver meaningful interventions based on an underpinning methodology of resilience that creates lasting change
 - * A service where good practice is free to flourish unfettered by bureaucracy and unnecessary regulatory demands.
 - * Children are supported by and within their own family/ community wherever possible. Where children do come into care longer term their experience will be life changing for the better.
- HSCB have endorsed the New Forest District Council’s approach on mandatory safeguarding training for taxi drivers and will support implementation across the HCC area.
